BATON ROUGE, Louisiana (05/22/2020) – The East Baton Rouge Council on Aging (EBRCOA) announces that due to the threat of Tropical Storm Cristobal and in coordination with the office of Mayor-President Sharon Weston Broome, all senior center locations and agency offices will be closed on Monday, June 8, 2020, out of an abundance of caution.

The agency advises all seniors to remain home and off of the roads. Seniors should continue to stay tuned to local news stations for any alerts or changes regarding Tropical Storm Cristobal. The agency advises for any medical emergencies to call 9-1-1.

"Although we will be closed on Monday, it is critical that our seniors continue to receive their meals and services without interruption. In anticipation of the storm, congregate seniors received an extra meal and Monday recipients of Meals on Wheels received their meals. In addition, we have provided sandbags to seniors throughout the parish. I urge my seniors to prepare for the upcoming storm and to stay safe," states Chief Executive Officer, Tasha Clark-Amar.
