## EBRCOA Closed Tuesday and Wednesday Due to Inclement Weather

**BATON ROUGE, Louisiana** (1/14/2024) – The East Baton Rouge Council on Aging (EBRCOA) announced that due to the high possibility of inclement weather and hard freeze all offices and senior center locations will be closed Tuesday, January 16th, and Wednesday, January 17, 2024. Normal business operations will resume on Thursday, January 18<sup>th</sup>.

Team EBRCOA worked tirelessly through the weekend to ensure that the seniors they serve did not miss a meal during their closure. In preparation for the expected hard freeze, congregate seniors received shelf-stable meals on Sunday, January 14<sup>th</sup>. Homebound seniors who ordinarily would receive their Meals on Wheels boxes on Tuesday or Wednesday received their boxes on Sunday, January 14<sup>th</sup>.

The agency advises all seniors to stay home and refrain from traveling on the roads. Tune into local news for any news alerts or changes regarding reopening. The agency advises for any medical emergencies to call 9-1-1.

"We strongly encourage seniors to get any supplies they may need now. Prepare now so that you can stay home comfortably and refrain from traveling during the extreme temperatures," stated Tasha Clark-Amar, Chief Executive Officer of EBRCOA.
